# International and Regional "Guidelines" Preservation and Restoration of Wooden Structures

#### Type of International Guidelines

- Charters
- Declarations
- Recommendations
- Conventions

#### Type of International Guidelines

- Declarations moral or political commitment, linking States on the basis of good faith.
- Recommendations invitation to one or more States to follow certain actions or conduct.
- Conventions international treaty, that needs to be ratified by the government of each country. Legal commitment involved.

#### Type of International Guidelines

- <u>Charters</u> (from Oxford American dictionary)
  - a written grant by a country's legislative or sovereign power, by which an institution such as a company, college, or city is created and its rights and privileges defined.
  - a written constitution or description of an organization's functions.



- 1931 Athens Charter
  - Conserving the original and authentic artifact or monument rather than rebuilding.
  - Accurate documentation
  - Backfilling for materials impossible to preserve
  - International collaboration between professionals.
  - Mostly European participants at the meeting.



- After WWII, attempt to provide more efficient international organizations by means of which possible misunderstanding between nations could be settled without armed conflict.
- promotion of educational, scientific and cultural cooperation

- 1945 Changes from:
  - League of Nations to United Nations Organization (ONU)
  - International Committee of Intellectual Cooperation to UNESCO
  - International Museums Office to ICOM (1946)

- 1954 UNESCO <u>Convention</u> on the Protection of Cultural Property in the Event of Armed Conflict with Regulations for the Execution of the Convention (Hague Convention)
  - Second protocol (2003)
  - Use of the emblem of the Blue Shield



 1956 - <u>UNESCO Recommendation</u> on International Principles applicable to archaeological excavations

 1959 - Creation of ICCROM, based in Rome

- 1964 Venice Charter (then adopted by ICOMOS)
  - Avoiding reconstruction, except for anastylosis
  - Modern techniques, distinguishable from the original materials
  - Need to respect historical integrity



- 1964 <u>UNESCO Recommendation</u> on the Means of Prohibiting and Preventing the Illicit Export, Import and Transfer of Ownership of Cultural Property
- 1965 Creation of ICOMOS



- 1970 <u>UNESCO Convention</u> on the Means of Prohibiting and Preventing the Illicit Import, Export and Transfer of Ownership of Cultural Property
- 1972 <u>UNESCO Recommendation</u> concerning the Protection, at National Level, of the Cultural and Natural Heritage

- 1972 UNESCO <u>Convention</u> concerning the Protection of the World Cultural and Natural Heritage
  - World Heritage Committee
  - World Heritage Centre
  - Outstanding universal value



- 1979 Australia ICOMOS <u>Burra</u> <u>Charter</u>
  - Australian adaptation to the Venice Charter
  - Methodology and sequence for the management and conservation of places of cultural significance
  - Logical step-by-step process, but not magical recipe
  - Traditional use of places stakeholders



- 1994 Nara Document on authenticity
  - Recognition of cultural diversity and plurality of values
  - Sense of authenticity resting on values and meanings attributed to places by society through time



- 2000 China principles
- 2000 ASEAN Declaration on Cultural Heritage
- 2001 UNESCO Convention on the Protection of the Underwater Cultural Heritage
- 2003 UNESCO Convention for the Safeguarding of the Intangible Cultural Heritage

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- 2003 -The Hoi An Declaration on Conservation of Historic Districts of Asia
  - 1. Conserving Asia's Historic Districts
  - 2. Involving Inhabitants in the Conservation of Historic Districts
  - 3. Integrating **Tourism** Development and Preservation of Cultural Heritage



- 4. Integrating Risk-Preparedness in Conservation Planning




#### How to "use" them?

- Guidelines are useful to identify different types of heritage resources and to indicate appropriate types of protection and conservation policies.
- But there is no template or recipe conservation is a critical process and a cultural choice.

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# 3. Folk Cultural Properties

## Tangibles and Intangibles

- (Tangible) clothe, tools and implements, houses, and other objects used in connection with intangible folk cultural properties
- (Intangible) manners and customs related to food, clothing and housing, to occupations, religious faith, and annual events etc.
- Designation / Registration system
  - Important Tangible Folk Cultural Properties
  - Important Intangible Folk Cultural Properties
  - Registered Tangible Folk Cultural Properties
  - + selection for make records/documentation

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


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
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
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### 4. Monuments

- Three main part
  - Historic Sites
  - Places of Scenic Beauty
  - Natural Monuments
- Designation / Registration system
  - Three designation system (noted above)
  - Registered Monuments



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
- Area-based protection
  - Post towns, castle towns, Farming or Fishing villages
- Different system
  - Decided by municipalities, then selected by central government
  - also connected with town planning law


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
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
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#### 6. Cultural Landscape


- It's new!
  - Introduced in 2004
  - "landscapes that have evolved in association with the modes of life or livelihoods of the people and the geo-cultural features of the region, which are indispensable to the understanding of the lifestyles and/or livelihoods of the people of Japan"
  - Influenced by World Heritage style
- Selection System
  - Similar to the system of Groups of Traditional Buildings
  - also connected with Landscape Act

#### For supporting conservation of CP


- Theoretically, they themselves are not cultural properties.






